RESNA, The Rehabilitation Engineering and Assistive Technology Society of North America: Laura Bigo of Nashwauk, Chris Schedin of Bowstring, John Huju of Grand Rapids, and Skeeter Carkhuff of St. Cloud are now credentialed as ATP (Assistive Technology Professional). Certification requires 3 years of experience plus, ongoing education and the 4 hour certification exam administered by RESNA . This ensures the consumer safeguards and increases consumer satisfaction with the service and delivery process for mobility equipment..

RESNA requirements include a combination of relevant education and experience, as well as adherence to a Code of Ethics and rules as outlined in the RESNA Standards of Practice. Effective April 1st Medicare will require a credentialed ATS to be directly involved with selection and delivery of power wheelchairs for people who have neurological, muscular, congenital deformities as well as a variety of other conditions.
